The first Olympic Games occurred around 776 B.C. in the valley of Olympia, where athletes from the Greek states met every four years to compete. The games were held to worship the god Zeus, who had a large temple nearby. At first, there was only running, but new events were added, including boxing, wrestling, and training and rewarded for winning. As with the modern Olympics, athletes were supported in their training and rewarded for winning. They were also carefully watched to ensure there was no cheating. Women, foreigners, and slaves could not compete or even watch. Women held their own competition, called the Heraea in honor of the goddess Hera, Zeus's wife.

The Olympics were ended when Rome turned to Christianity 1,100 years after the first game because the games worshipped Zeus. It would be another 1,500 years

On August 8th, 2009, Typhoon Morakot struck Taiwan with winds as high as 150 kilometer per hour. Over the next 24 hours, up to 2.6 meters of rain would fall on Taiwan, causing extensive flooding. More than NT\$10 billion was lost as farms, buildings, roads, and bridges were washed away. Tragically, hundreds of people died, mainly due to landslides. In the town of Xiaolin, nearly 400 individuals perished.

The reason Taiwan is plagued by landslides is apparent to most people. In Taiwan,
