Since then, its stock price has increased significantly, reflecting confidence among investors that the company will continue to grow. One of Oatly's competitors is Glebe Farm Foods Ltd., a British company that makes an oat milk brand called PureOatly. The process involved in producing this product involves a number of steps. First, oat seeds are planted in fields. When the crop is mature, it is harvested using farm machinery. (33). In the next step, so-called "milling" machines are

used to grind the raw oaks into flour. Water is then added to the flower to create a liquid. Salt and oil from sunflowers are added to the liquid, which is then subjected to a heat treatment. After the treatment had ended, the oat milk is packaged for sale in stores.

From Manarola, hikers can proceed to Corniglia, the smallest and highest village of Cinque Terre. One of the village's landmarks is St. Peter's Church, which has a white marble window carved in the shape of a rose.

The next village along the trail is Vernazza. Olive groves grow nearby on steep, terraced slopes. The tower of Doria Castle, built in the 15th century to protect the village from pirates, sits above the bay. Many lively cafés line the main cobblestone street.

The last village along the trail is Monterosso, which has beautiful reefs full of colorful creatures and a wonderful beach. This village is also known for its lemon trees and annual Lemon Festival.

① Among the unique features of the villages are their terraced slopes, which are most easily observed around Vernazza and Manarola. ② For centuries, villagers grew grape vines and olive and lemon trees on the terraces. ③ In recent times, tourism has replaced agriculture as the villages' main source of income. ④ Consequently, many terraces have been abandoned, and the stone walls that hold them in place have not been maintained. ⑤ When 15 inches of rain fell on Vernazza in 2011, the stone walls collapsed. ⑥ This resulted in landslides that caused terrible damage in Vernazza and Manarola.

Since that event, concerned citizens have formed an association with the goal of repairing and maintaining the stone walls. So far, 4,000 acres of stone walls have been repaired. Much of the abandoned land has also been put back to use.

第二篇

Once widespread throughout the eastern part of United States, the timber rattlesnake is now on the verge of being endangered and is almost extinct in some of the eastern states where it once thrived. Compared with its western cousins, the timber rattlesnake appears more vulnerable due to its certain behavior adapted to cope with the cold climate.

Like all reptiles, rattlesnakes are found mostly in warmer places in that they cannot internally generate or regulate their own body temperature. The warmth of sun provides them with the heat they need. However, roughly 8,000 years ago when glaciers retreated, timber rattlesnakes migrated into the colder northern areas. In order to survive the cold in these northern regions, timber rattlesnakes developed certain strategies of their own; however, it is these adaptive behaviors that ultimately make them fall victim to human predation, their main threat.

"Hibernation" is one of the numerous survival strategies that the timber rattlesnakes have developed. For approximately eight months, they are seen to remain motionless in deep but frost-free crevices, with their body temperature dropping as low as 40 degrees Fahrenheit. When they emerge again in springtime, they need to sun for three to four days on rocks in the open wild to warm their chilled bodies. This peculiar behavior, along with their tendency to congregate in large numbers at their wintering sites, makes them easy prey. Pregnant females are particularly vulnerable as they need to bask in the sun for a longer period of time to hatch their eggs. Besides, females have very long interbirth intervals, and they only reproduce every three to five years. If frost or cold comes late that year, the entire litter of 6 to 12 young may die. Efforts are underway to protect the timber rattlesnakes and their habitats from further human depredation, but in many cases it is already too late.
