I. The British remake of the French musical based on the 19th century novel *Les Misérables* by Victor Hugo swept the globe in the 1980s and 1990s. The stirring music and special effects drew millions of people to the show, along with the moving story and the powerful request for equality through revolution. Not only did it thrill a generation of theater goers, but it inspired a revolution of its own.

The story focuses on the lower class in the 19th century in France, and specifically, on Jean Valjean, a man who is constantly trying to better himself and others in a world that is cruel and unfair. After serving an extended jail term for stealing food to feed his family, he is labeled as an ex-convict for the rest of his life. Trying to remove this label, he changes his identity. He soon becomes a factory owner and mayor of a small town. Once again, though, the society was still cruel to him. The climax of the story is in the many failed uprisings of the period, one of which led by idealistic students.

The 1980s were a golden age of musical theater, with other hit musicals such as *Cats* and *Phantom of the Opera. Les Misérables*, though, had more energy and meaning in its plot and musical effects. Near the end of the show, all characters are sucked into that doomed uprising. As some of them die during and after the revolution, the emotions of the story and music impress the audiences.

In the show, the young people's desire to reverse the unjust society to one more free and open. The citizens try hard to make their voice heard. Just like the chorus for the musical's revolution song goes, "Do you hear the people sing?" The lyrics of the song are powerful, and they call for the government to put citizens' opinions first.

Then, comes the most difficult moment when you have to put your pet down. On that final day, try to make your pet as comfortable as you can. Bring their favorite snacks and keep them warm with their favorite blanket. The vet will tell you every step in an euthanasia process, so there will be no surprises. You just have to say goodbye, give your pet one last pat on the head, and scratch under their chin. When

you're ready, the vet will give the animal the drug that allows your pet to peacefully pass away.

Afterward, you might bury your pet at home in the yard or have them cremated and spread their ashes on their favorite spot. The most important thing of all is to do whatever brings you and your family the most closure.

#### The Debate on Euthanasia

The word, euthanasia, is from the Ancient Greek, meaning "good death." It is the practice of ending a life, usually with an injection. The ancient Greeks and Romans considered suicide tolerable if there was no hope for the patient. For example, the elderly could choose euthanasia if they wished. Nowadays it is only legal in a few countries.

Even in Taiwan, euthanasia is still illegal despite the fact that there are many people hoping to legalize euthanasia under certain circumstances.

Euthanasia is a deeply debated topic. Some people think it is murder while others think it is mercy. Supporters of euthanasia believe the quality of life is more valuable than how long you live. Also, the medical costs used on keeping someone merely alive may be better used on a cure for a disease.

Other people believe euthanasia is against the oath that a doctor makes. When medical students become doctors, they take an oath in which they promise to never cause a death through a deadly prescription. Another belief is that euthanasia is morally wrong. It is considered suicide by some people. And if you assist someone to end his or her life, that is murder. In the film, The Sea Inside, the main character, Ramon, is paralyzed and wishes to commit suicide. During an argument with a priest, the priest tells him "Freedom without a life is not freedom." However, Ramon answers with "A life without freedom is not a life."

There are many sides to the debate on euthanasia, and many people feel very strongly about the issue. This is very likely one debate that may continue for many years.
