♦ How to skim

To skim a text, first read the title and subtitle (if any). Then, quickly read through the first few lines or paragraphs, paying close attention to any keywords, which are often bolded or italicized. 31.

Scanning is reading fast to find specific information in a text. For example, if you wanted to check a train's schedule on an electronic board at a train station, you would scan the board for your train number and locate the information you need.

♦ How to scan

Before you begin scanning a text, 32. If you have no clue about the text's purpose or meaning, then it will be hard to look for specific information through scanning.

Next, since scanning involves searching for specific information in a text, keep what information you're

searching for in mind.

Finally, 33. If the text is divided into sections by subheadings, then the text will be easier to scan. If there are no subheadings or other types of divisions, then skim each paragraph to understand its overall meaning and determine whether the information you're looking for might be found there.
