In order to understand how planes fly, we need to look at the physics of flight. A plane that is flying is acted on by four forces: lift, gravity, thrust, and drag. Lift keeps the plane in the air. The force <u>47.</u> against it is gravity, which pulls the plane down. The shape of a plane's wings creates lift. Air moves faster over the top of the wing than the <u>48.</u> When air moves faster, air pressure gets lower. The Great Barrier Reef*, located in Australia, is the world's largest coral reef system. It is made up of over 2,900 individual reefs and 900 islands. In fact, it is larger than the Great Wall of China and is the only living thing on earth that can be viewed from outer space. Although it is an international treasure, its existence has been threatened by environmental factors. Climate change is one of the biggest threats to the Great Barrier Reef. With rising ocean temperatures, corals begin to kick out the algae* that live inside their tissues. These small plants provide up to 90 percent of the corals' energy, maintaining their health. Without these **tenants**, the corals become unhealthy and lose their bright colors. In fact, in 2016, this condition killed between 29 to 50 percent of the reef's corals.

Aside from climate change, pollution is another factor that has worsened the state of this natural wonder. Chemical pollution comes from using too much fertilizer*. The excess substance gets washed into rivers, drifting to the Great Barrier Reef. The fertilizer itself contains nutrients* that assist the growth of food for starfish larvae*. After growing up, these starfish then feast on the corals at a rate faster than the corals can reproduce.

Whether it is climate change or pollution, there is no doubt the Great Barrier Reef is in danger. Drastic measures must be put in place to stop this prized living structure from further decline.
