In certain forests, when you look up you will see a network of cracks formed by gaps between the outermost edges of tree branches. It looks like a precisely engineered jigsaw puzzle, each branch growing just perfectly so it almost, 6, touches the neighboring tree. This beautiful phenomenon is called crown shyness.

Scientists have been discussing crown shyness since the 1920s, proposing <u>7</u> explanations for the phenomenon. Some researchers point out that as trees often grow close together, treetops can easily collide and break when swayed by the wind. In order to protect their branches from breakage, trees maintain "shyness gaps"—spaces large enough to prevent them from touching their neighbors.

Other scientists suggest that plants, like animals, <u>8</u> resources—nutrients, water, space, and light. In forested areas with thick tree crowns, there is intense struggle for these resources. Gaps in the treetops resulting from crown shyness may allow trees to increase their <u>9</u> light and enhance photosynthesis. Additionally, by having branches that do not touch those of their neighbors, trees may be able to limit the spread of leaf-eating insects, and potentially also the transmission of diseases from tree to tree. <u>10</u> decades of investigation, there is no consensus on exactly what causes the beautiful and mysterious phenomenon of crown shyness.

Everyone needs to eat, and yet nowadays many people have only a rudimentary idea of where their food comes from. Even fresh fruit and vegetables, which 24 little processing, change hands several times before they end up on your table. The first part of this article will offer an overview of how fruit and vegetables get from the farms where they are grown to the people who 25 eat them. The second will discuss a few changes that the European Union (EU) is making to try to make this process more sustainable.

Fruit and vegetables are grown on farms that care for the plants. They are watered, treated with pesticides that 26 them from insects and given fertilizer, which provides them with necessary nutrients. Eventually the fruit and vegetables are harvested, either 27 or by machine. They are then sent to factories that clean them and may cut, dry or process them in other ways. They are then put into packaging, if appropriate, or boxed and sent to warehouses. The warehouses 28 them and prepare them to be distributed to grocery stores, and these grocery stores sell them to consumers, who eventually eat them.

The EU's European Commission has adopted what it calls the Farm to Fork Strategy, which <u>29</u> to improve food production and distribution processes. The strategy has several goals, which include promoting environmentally friendly processes for growing, processing and distributing food. Imagine a modern enterprise that executes around 400,000 transactions daily with an error rate of merely one in sixteen million. You might expect only highly advanced computers to be capable of such levels of accuracy, but actually, only simple tools like bicycles and colored pens are used. <u>31</u> What company could this possibly be?

It's the Nutan Mumbai Tiffin Box Suppliers Association, a home-cooked lunch delivery organization situated in Mumbai, India. This company delivers around 200,000 home-made lunches daily to office and factory workers. Its success is due in large part to its employees, known as dabbawalas. <u>32</u> Since most Mumbai residents live in the suburbs and have to commute⁷ long distances to work every day, it's inconvenient for them to carry their lunches on cramped public transportation. Therefore, dabbawalas provide a useful service by enabling workers to sit down to healthy, home-made midday meals in their offices.

The dabbawalas' delivery network has fascinated many people because it achieves a high level of efficiency through nothing but smart scheduling and teamwork. This is how it works: Each geographical area employs around twenty-five dabbawalas, each of whom collects roughly thirty tiffin boxes. These boxes are then swiftly sorted according to their general destinations before being loaded onto trains for delivery. Then, the dabbawalas board their trains and travel with the lunchboxes. At each destination train station, these boxes are sorted again. <u>33</u> Not until this second round of sorting has been completed can each tiffin box be delivered to its rightful owner. In the afternoon, the dabbawalas retrace their original routes in order to bring back each empty lunchbox to its owner's home.

In a massive system resembling a relay race, each tiffin box is handled by at least three dabbawalas between its owner's home and workplace. Many people are curious about how the Nutan team ensures that lunches are always delivered on time and don't accidentally get delivered to the wrong location. <u>34</u> To be specific, dabbawalas avoid mix-ups by writing special numbers and characters on each container's lid to indicate the particular neighborhood, building, floor, and other delivery details. In addition, color schemes are used to show the train station of origin. Together, these tactics ensure accurate delivery to a high degree of success.

Because of the nearly flawless operating system of the dabbawalas, this food delivery service is recognized as a classic example of efficiency and teamwork. It has been studied by Harvard Business School and is greatly admired by the courier company FedEx. Without a doubt, the service performed by dabbawalas is a true model of excellence.

Schindler's Ark, written by Thomas Keneally, is a historical novel based on the true story of Oskar Schindler, a German industrialist who saved the lives of more than a thousand Jewish refugees during World War II. Nazi war effort. Schindler, at first, is a member of the Nazi Party and sees the war and the Holocaust as opportunities to enrich himself, but he gradually becomes more sympathetic to the plight of the Jews in Poland.

As Schindler begins to see the horror of the Nazi regime firsthand, he uses his wealth and influence to protect his Jewish workers from deportation and execution. He bribes officials, forges documents, and even risks his own life to save as many people as possible. In the end, Schindler's efforts are successful, and he manages to save more than a thousand Jewish lives.

Schindler's Ark is a powerful and moving novel that explores the themes of human kindness and heroism in the face of evil. It tells the story of a flawed but ultimately heroic man who puts his own life on the line to save others. Keneally's writing is evocative and powerful, and he portrays the horrors of the Holocaust with unflinching honesty.

The novel was adapted into a critically acclaimed film, Schindler's List, directed by Steven Spielberg in 1993. The film won seven Academy Awards, including Best Picture, and helped to bring Schindler's story to a wider audience.

Many people around the world are passionate about camping.
