Helping others is another great way to keep everyone safe. Once one person falls down, more people tend to fall over them. So if your neighbor in the crowd falls to the ground, help them up.

Every year, Thailand sees millions of tourists, many of whom have a lot of fun riding elephants. In fact, this activity is often the highlight of a visitor's vacation, and these rides bring a lot of money into the Thai economy. However, there is a dark side to elephant tourism that would horrify many travelers.

Due to high demand in Thailand's tourism industry, the illegal trade of young elephants has developed. Being highly social creatures in their natural habitat, elephants often travel great distances in herds that are led by females. Unfortunately, a number of young wild elephants are lured away from their mothers and into traps by brutal trappers. Any females from the herd which try to protect their innocent babies may be shot mercilessly. The elephants that fall victim to the traps are then sold to tour operators. That is when the real horror begins, as the elephants are often violently abused. These young elephants are confined in very small cages. Furthermore, they are beaten without mercy for days and even struck with sharp nails. Such psychological torture and physical abuse, both of which cause extreme suffering, are committed to make them obedient to their human trainers.

Once the elephants are tamed, they are forced into a life of slavery. Many of them are made to carry people on their backs at tourist attractions and elephant camps. Since an elephant's spine is vulnerable to pressure from above, carrying heavy tourists for hours every day can lead to painful, permanent back injuries. What's more, they are denied an adequate amount of food and water, which further contributes to their exhaustion. Worse still, these elephants are beaten as they work; their flesh is struck with bullhooks. On average, more than 13 million tourists ride elephants in Thailand every year. This puts money in the pockets of those who capture and take advantage of them, which allows the cruel elephant trade to continue.

Supply never comes without demand, and it is high time that we dealt with the roots of this problem. When you visit Thailand, avoid companies profiting from elephant tourism. As an alternative, visit one of Thailand's three national parks where wild elephants roam free. There, you can take pleasure in seeing these complex, intelligent animals as they happily go about their lives in peace.

If something is interesting, fun, and exciting in some way, people may become addicted to it. Typically, when we think of addiction, we often picture quite negative behavior, including taking drugs, smoking, or drinking too much alcohol. But what about using the internet too much?

The idea of internet addiction was first theorized in 1995 by Dr. Ivan Goldberg, but it was talked about in a somewhat joking manner then. At that time, many homes still did not have a computer, and there were no cellphones because they hadn't hit the market yet. Nowadays, we live in the digital age, where people have constant access to the internet if they wish. Mental health experts now believe that internet addiction actually exists, but there is no general agreement as to how exactly how it should be defined.

A general rule regarding addiction is that it occurs when a compulsion to engage in an activity results in a negative impact on people's daily lives or causes them to have mental distress. However, the question with internet addiction is, "How much internet use is too much?" Because of this, it shouldn't be surprising that estimates vary widely as to how much of the world's population is addicted to the internet. Some studies suggest about 38% of those with internet access suffer from this type of problem. In contrast, other studies have indicated that it is more likely that only about 8% of internet users are addicted to it. **Whatever the true figures are**, individuals whose online behavior has led to social isolation, poor sleeping habits, or financial problems should consider seeking help to improve their quality of life.
