Over the past three years, eggs have become more expensive. The price increase was caused by several factors that were 21 the global egg market and how eggs are produced.

The first major problem began during the COVID-19 pandemic, when it became more expensive to ship feed to chicken farms. This raised costs for farmers. In addition, during COVID-19 lockdowns, people were stuck at home. This development led to a sudden decrease in demand for eggs. Therefore, farmers scaled down their egg 22.

However, as lockdowns ended, demand rapidly returned. Meat also became more expensive, so people began buying more eggs. The supply of eggs couldn't 23 with the sudden increase in demand, so the price of eggs went up.

It was October 28, 1886. Even though it was a rainy day in New York City, close to a million people were out for their first look at the city's newest addition on Bedloe's Island, <u>36</u>. Each part of the statue has a special meaning. In her left hand, Lady Liberty holds a giant tablet with the date "July 4, 1776" on it. It was on this day that the United States became independent, and the tablet symbolize a new and free America. A giant torch, which symbolizes that Lady Liberty lights the way to freedom, is held firmly in her right hand.

Today, the Statue of Liberty is one of America's biggest tourist attractions. 39 As always, Lady Liberty stands tall and proud. She is a symbol of hope and freedom for visitors from around the globe.

In the nineteenth century, New York City was not a pleasant place to live in. The city was a dirty, rotten mess. People did not yet have running water or toilets in their homes, so they relieved themselves in buckets. They'd then throw the waste out their windows or doors onto the street. At the same time, most people got around by using horse-drawn carts, so there was often horse waste all over the place as well.

Additionally, this was during a time before garbage trucks and trash collection systems existed, and people just threw everything out onto the street. As you can imagine, this attracted pests such as mice and rats. This, in turn, led to an explosion of diseases such as cholera and typhoid fever. The city was also very crowded, and the local groundwater was frequently polluted by all the waste. These factors made the disease risk even greater. Thankfully, the nineteenth century was also an era of major developments in medicine, including the discovery of Aspirin by a German chemist in 1897.


