Matcha, a green tea, is not just a drink but a centuries-old tradition deeply rooted in Japanese culture. It Comes from Uji, Japan, where the tea plants grow 16 the ideal conditions. Over time, the process of 17 the leaves 17 powder has been improved. Farmers discovered the leaves were at their best when shaded. In a shaded environment, the plants 18 the light, making the leaves grow wider, thinner, more tender and nutrient-rich.

Therefore, 19 about 30 days before picking, farmers set up coverings over the tea plants. Only the finest, the youngest leaves are picked for matcha. These leaves are steamed and dried, and their veins and steams are 20 , before being stoned-ground into fine powder. This process keeps the leave’s vivid color and food value.

(B) In recent years, some of parts East Asia, North America, and northern Europe have been colder than normal in winter. Scientists believe Earth's warming trends are 26 this phenomenon. When it comes to the "North Pole" or the "Arctic region," People think of the coldest place on earth. In winter, the Arctic gets little sunlight, 27. To balance the temperature difference with the warmer equatorial region, a low-pressure area called polar vortex forms and circles around the pole. This happens about six to 20 kilometers above the Earth's surface, in a layer of the atmosphere called stratosphere. The polar vortex usually stays stable and keeps cold air in place. However, if sea ice melts 28 global warming, it can change this system and make temperature less stable. When this happens, the polar vortex might move south from the North Pole or 29 two or three separate parts that form far south of the pole.

The polar jet stream's air currents blow swiftly from west to east between 50 and 60 degrees latitude (like from France to Norway), keeping cold air in the north. But as the Arctic warms up, the difference in temperature between the Arctic and other regions decreases, this, 30, makes the jet stream weaker and more likely to move north and south, which can bring cold Arctic air to places like Mexico. So, warming in one area can lead to colder temperature in another.

The Japanese word kimono is composed of two parts, namely ki and mono. In English, ki means “to wear,” and mono simply means “thing.” Therefore, kimono can be translated into English as “thing to wear.” A kimono is a T-shaped, robe-like garment traditionally worn by a woman. The correct way to wear this garment is with the left side folded over the right side; it is only folded right over left when used to dress a dead person. Kimonos come in multiple types; for example, a kimono made to be worn in summer is called a yukata, which is a relatively casual garment made of a light fabric.

Until the middle of the nineteenth century, kimonos were a common, everyday fashion in Japan. At that time, the kimono was one of three parts that composed a samurai’s* uniform. However, the year 1868 saw the beginning of the Meiji era* in Japan. During this era, the country began to be influenced heavily by overseas cultures; Japanese citizens were encouraged to adopt more Western ways of life, including how they dressed. The result is that nowadays, kimonos tend to be reserved for formal occasions such as funerals, weddings, and traditional tea ceremonies. Nevertheless, the kimono remains an important symbol of Japan’s history and national identity.
