These birds are seen as hardworking, thus the saying "the early bird catches the worm" was coined. It suggests that a person who does something early or before other people is more likely to be successful.

Lastly, you may have noticed that if you trip over your dog that is sleeping peacefully on the floor, he might bite you. Because of this, it's best to "let sleeping dogs lie." This is a saying that means to ignore a problem so as not to cause any trouble.
